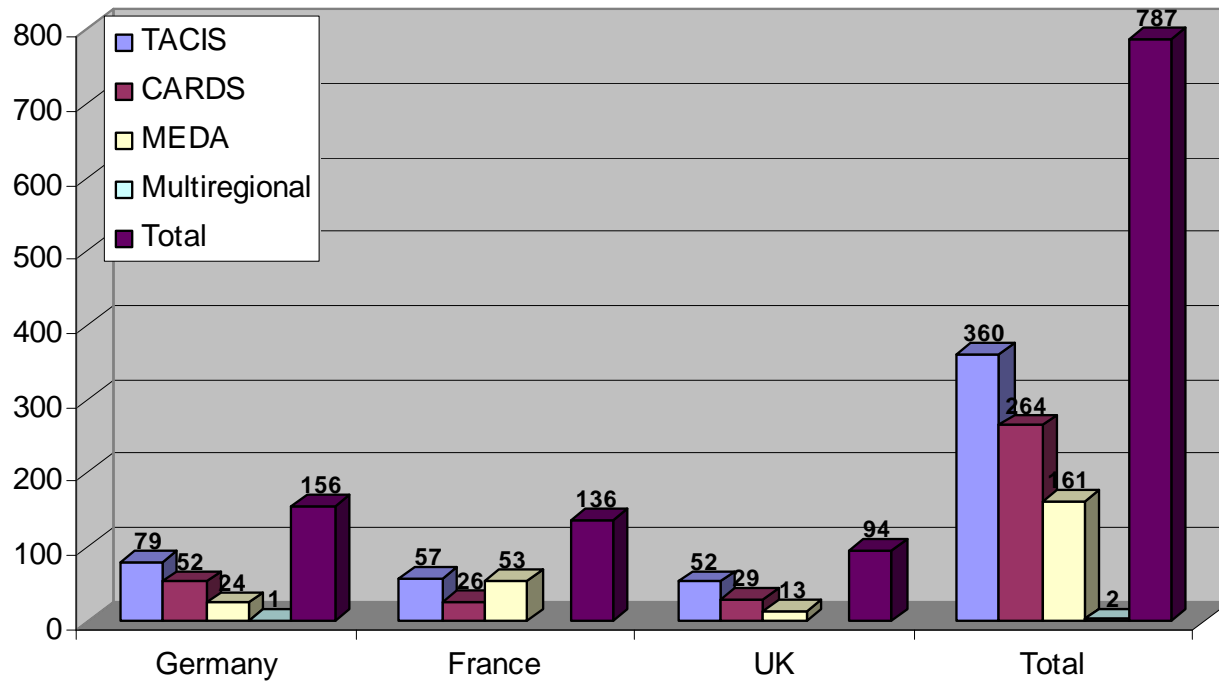

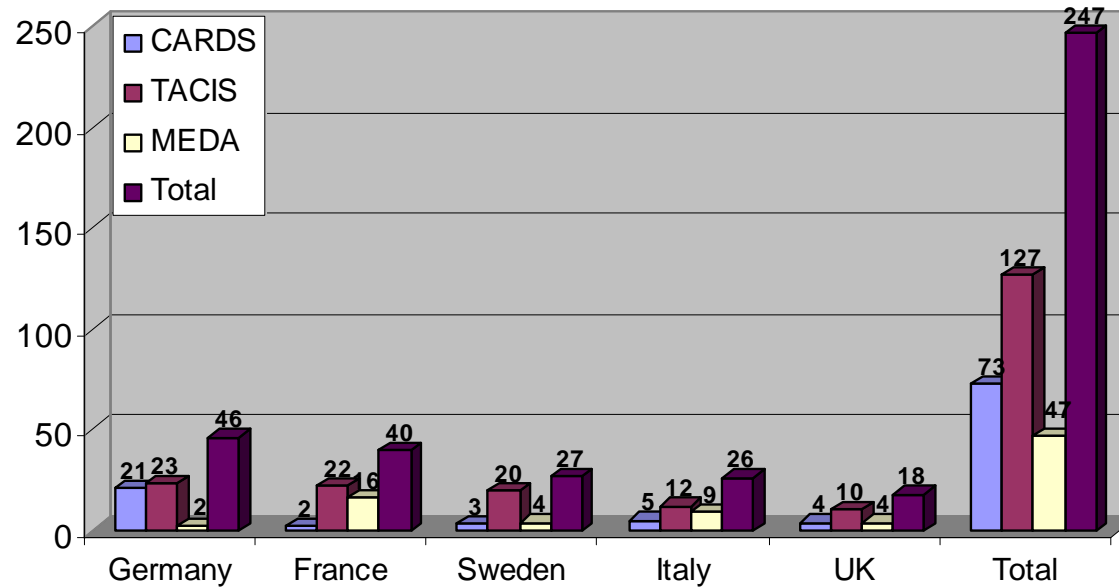
TEMPUS III - Joint European Projects

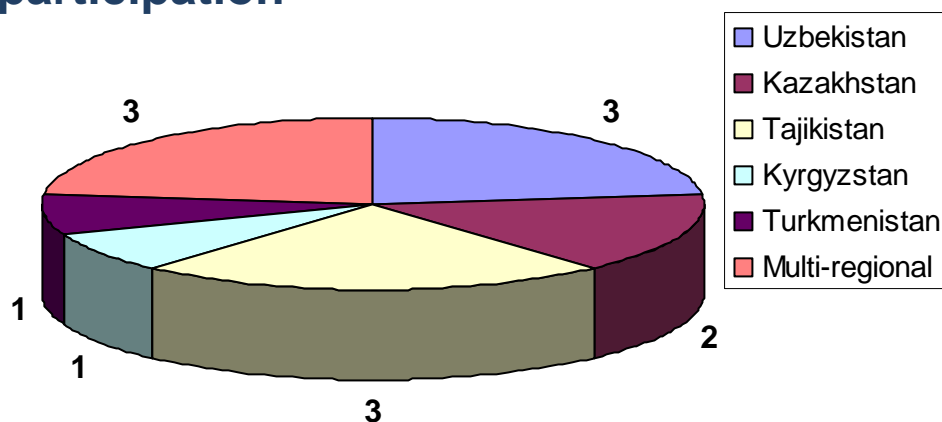
TEMPUS III - Structural Measures (2003-2006)

Running TEMPUS Joint European Projects (JEP) in Central Asia with German participation

Subject areas: Quality assurance, accreditation, Bologna process and university-enterprise cooperation.



TEMPUS IV (2007-2013)

Objective: to establish an area of cooperation and modernisation in higher education between the European Union and the partner countries in the surrounding area, including Central Asia. Strong linkage with EU higher education policies (Lisbon and Bologna).

Project types:	Joint Projects and Structural Measures
Grant size:	From EUR 500,000 to EUR 1,5 million
Minimum grant size for countries with annual budgets below EUR 1 million:	EUR 300,000 (Albania, Montenegro, Central Asia)
Project duration:	up to 36 months
Next call for proposals:	December 2008 (deadline: March/April 2009)

Applying successfully in TEMPUS IV

Preparatory steps (1)

Information

- Consult the TEMPUS homepage of the European Commission
<http://ec.europa.eu/tempus>
- Contact your National TEMPUS Office/
TEMPUS National Contact Point
- Make a seriously reflected choice of your partners
- Start your preparatory steps early enough as things always take longer than imagined



Applying successfully in TEMPUS IV

Preparatory steps (2)

Adequate project type

- Read the call for proposals carefully
- Select the adequate project type for your idea
- Involve your partners in the preparation process
- Decide on who is going to submit the proposal



Applying successfully in TEMPUS IV

Preparatory steps (3)

Eligible Partnerships

- For national projects: minimum of **6** institutions/partners
3 universities from 3 different EU countries + 3 universities from one partner country
- For multi-country projects: minimum of **5** institutions/partners
3 universities from 3 different EU countries + 2 universities from 2 different partner countries
- Public authorities and rector/teacher/student organisations eligible as applicants for Structural Measures
- Universities in Partner Countries can act as grant applicants



Applying successfully in TEMPUS IV

Preparatory steps (4)

Priorities

- Programme-wide priorities and project types are defined around the EU higher education modernisation agenda
- National priorities defined by the Ministries of Education for both Joint Projects and Structural Measures (selected from the programme-wide priorities)
- Strict adherence to national priorities for national projects (involving one single partner country)
- Programme-wide priorities for multi-country projects (involving more than one partner country)



Applying successfully in TEMPUS IV

Preparatory steps (5)

Maximise your chances of success

- Involve a representative number of higher education institutions from a partner country
- Involve non-academic consortium members
- Promote interregional cooperation activities
- Demonstrate that they actively involve students or their organisations
- Demonstrate a strong institutional and individual capacity building process
- Demonstrate a wider impact on higher education institutions and systems
