## A brief history of TEMPUS

**TEMPUS** *Trans-European Mobility Programme for University Studies*  
since 1993 *Trans-European Cooperation Scheme for Higher Education*

**TEMPUS I: adopted by the Council in 1990 to last until 1994,**  
designed to help the process of social and economic reform in the  
PHARE (*Pologne, Hongrie: Assistance à la Réstructuration Economique*) and  
TACIS (*Technical Assistance for the Commonwealth of Independent States*) region

**TEMPUS II: decided for the period 1994-1998** with a further extension in November  
1996 to allow activities under Tempus II to **continue until 2000.**

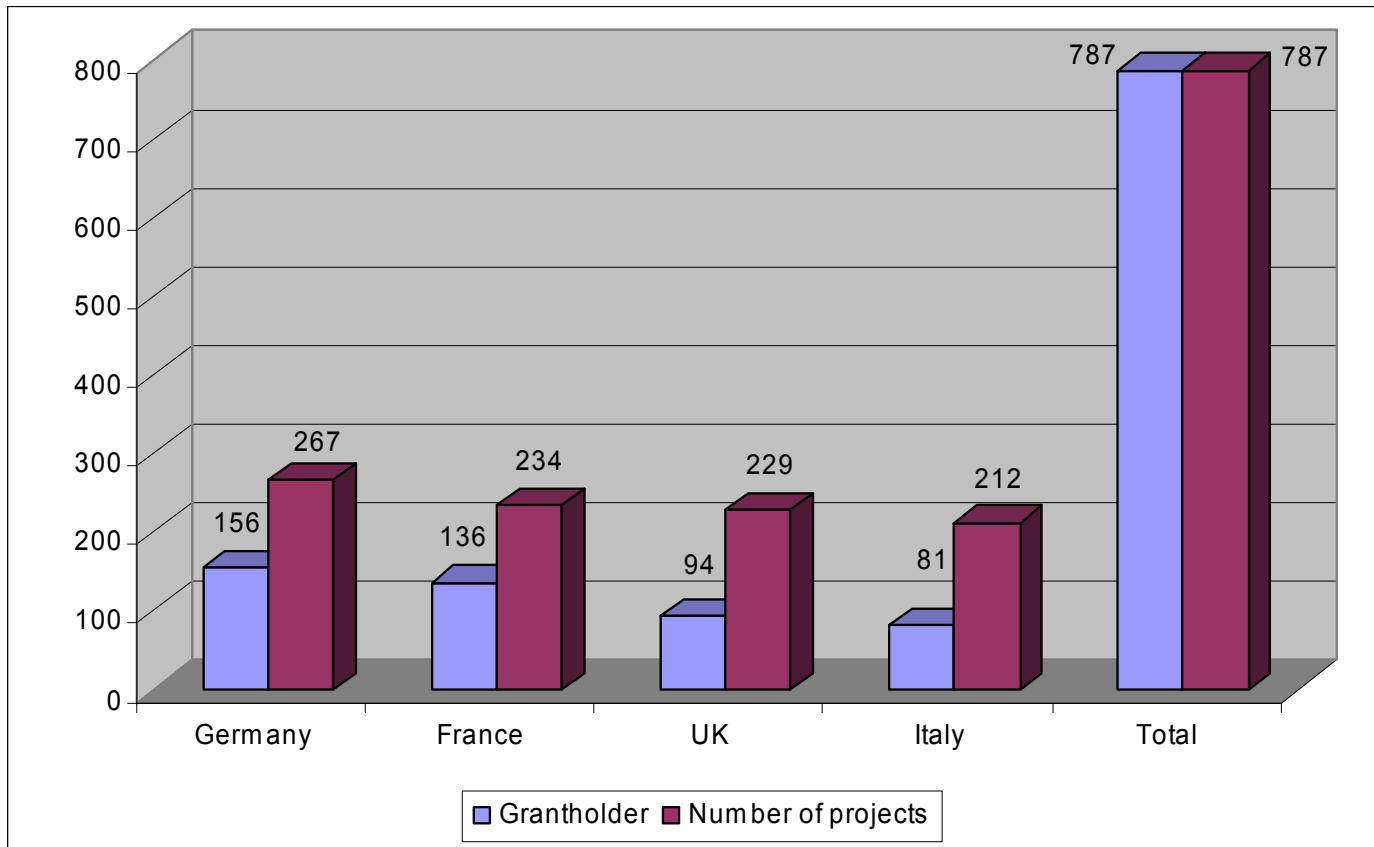
**TEMPUS III: adopted in April 1999 for the period from 2000 until 2006.** It concerns  
the eligible countries of the TACIS, CARDS (Western Balkans) and  
**since 2002 the MEDA region.**

**TEMPUS IV: decided in 2007 for the period 2007 - 2013** by the Commission,  
established with three different financing instruments.

## TEMPUS IV (2007-2013)

### First call for proposals, deadline 28 April 2008

Budget: € 50.55 million

- Western Balkans: € 15.65 million
- Southern Neighbouring area: € 11.2 million
- Eastern Neighbouring area: € 11.2 million
- Russia: € 8 million
- Central Asia: 4.5 million

### Second call for proposals, deadline 28 April 2009

Budget: € 53 million

- Western Balkans: € 17.7 million
- Southern Neighbouring area: € 11.4 million
- Eastern Neighbouring area: € 11.4 million
- Russia: € 8 million
- Central Asia: € 4.5 million



## TEMPUS IV (2007-2013)

### Proposals from EU member states and partner country institutions

## TEMPUS IV (2007-2013)

### Second call: evaluation of German applications

German institutions submitted **98 projects** of which **13** were ineligible for formal reasons.

The reasons for ineligibility in these cases are as follows:\*

Network requirements not fulfilled	10
Minimum grant size not respected	2
Supporting documents missing	1
Endorsement letter missing	1
Wrong person named as legal representative	1
Single matters of expense not listed	1

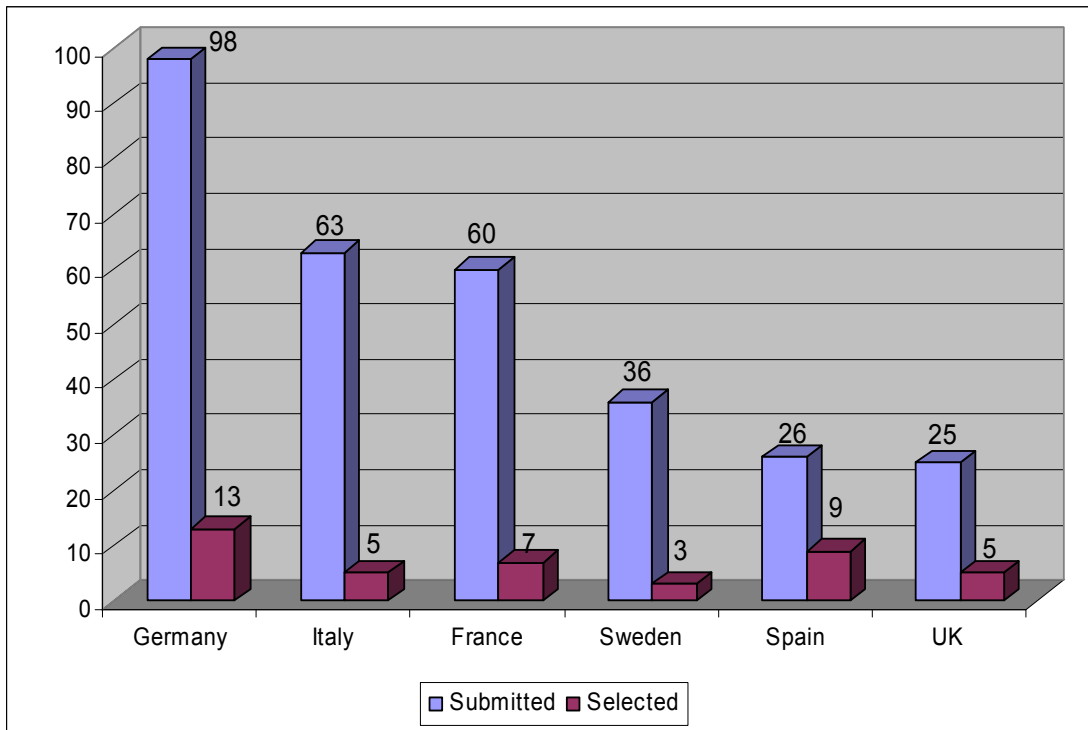
\*Sometimes multiple reasons within one application



## TEMPUS IV (2007-2013)

### Second call: submitted vs. selected applications by EU members

Selected*	13 (13 %)	5 (8 %)	7 (12 %)	3 (8 %)	9 (35 %)	5 (20 %)

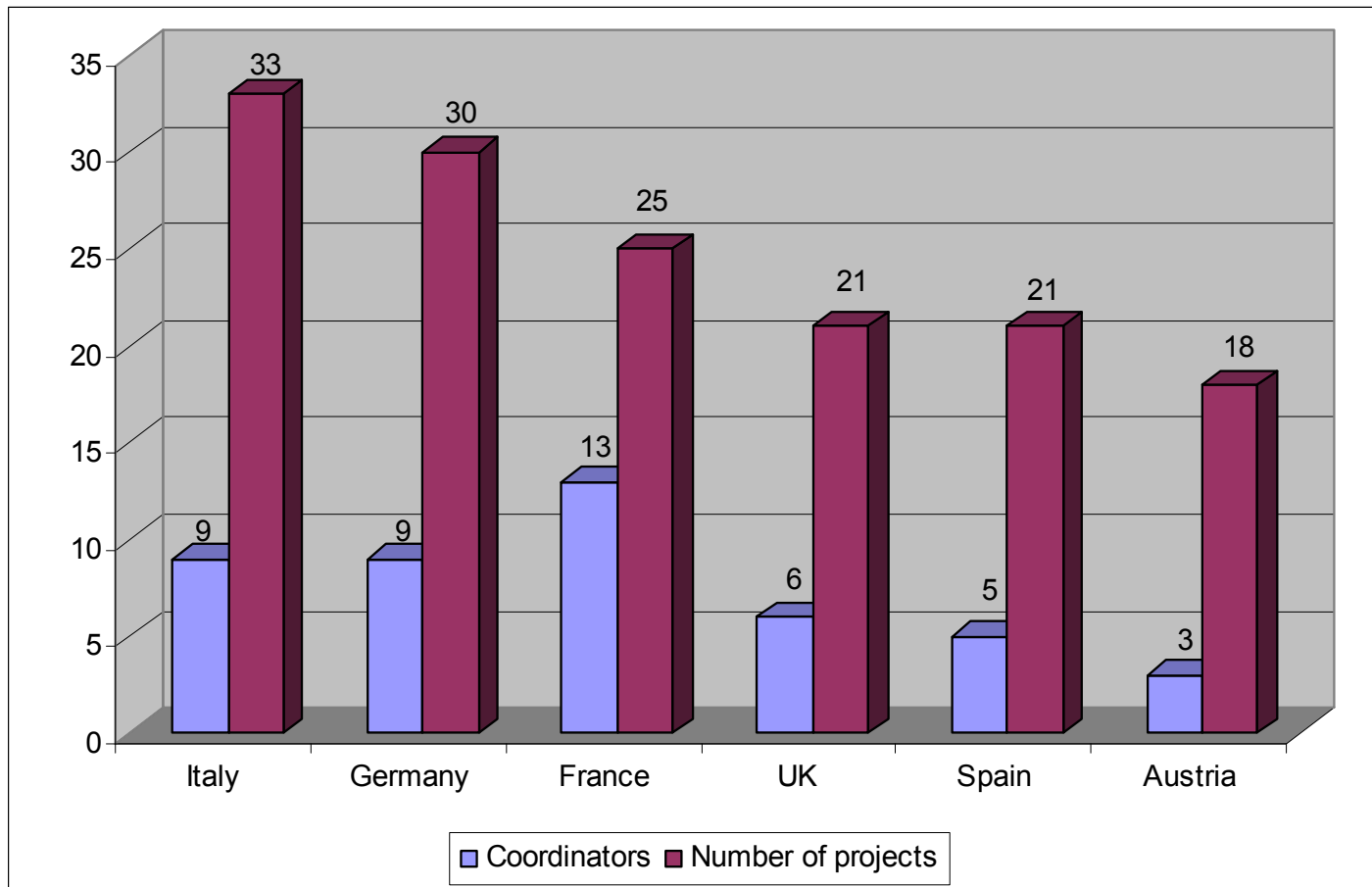


\*proportion of successful applications related to total no. of applications by country

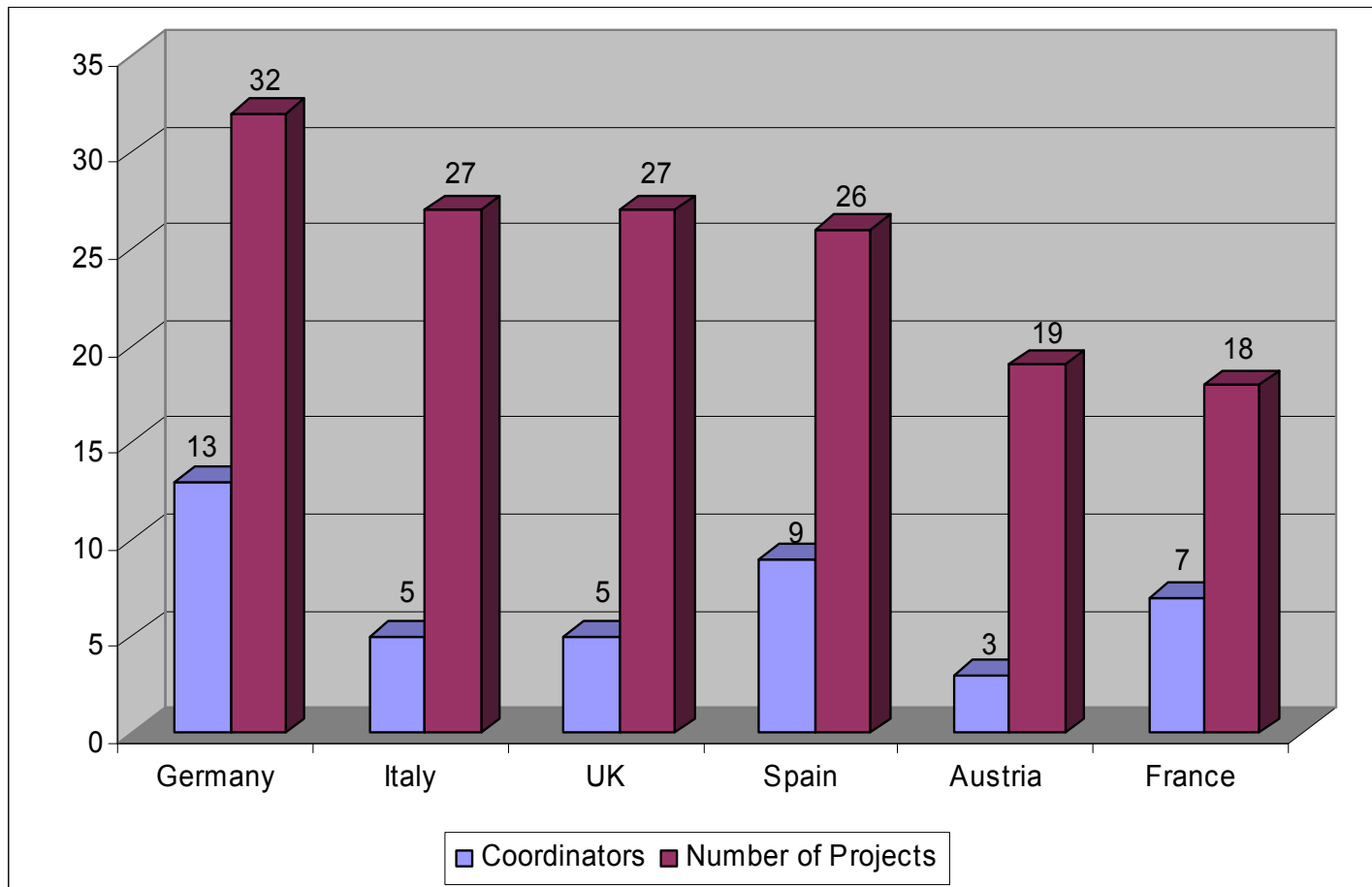
### First call: EU participation – selected projects

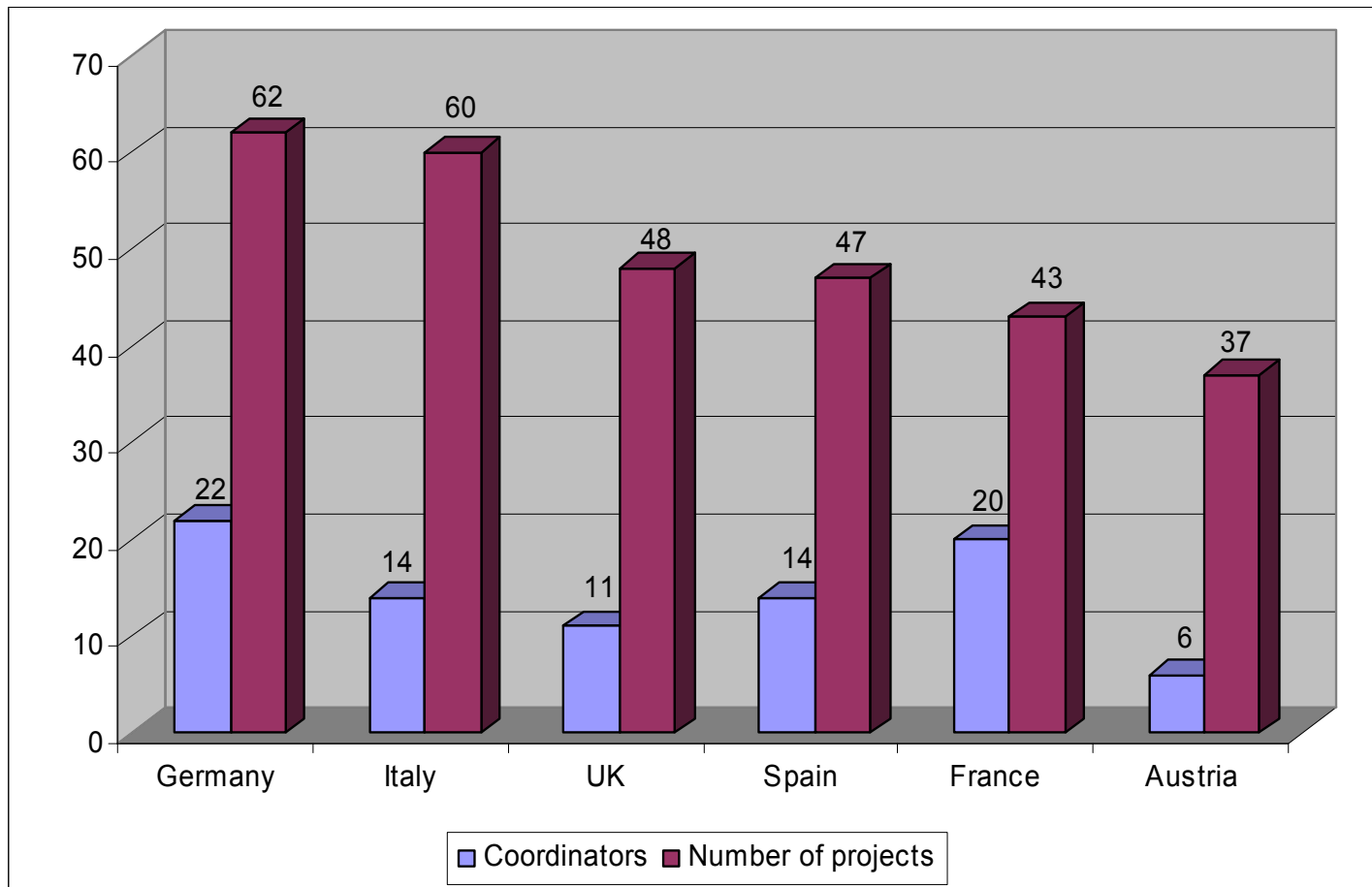

## Tempus IV (2007-2013)

### Conclusion drawn from the number of applications and projects submitted

- ▶ High interest in Tempus IV by German institutions
- ▶ Participation of German institutions at the top – as partners and coordinators
- ▶ Quality of proposals can be further improved to:
  - reduce the number of projects being ineligible
  - increase the success rate

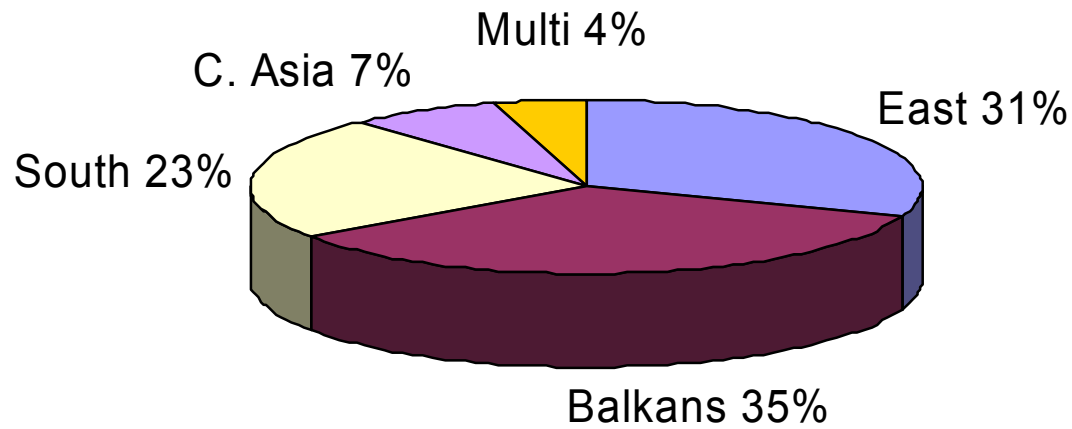
### Second call: total number of projects in partner regions

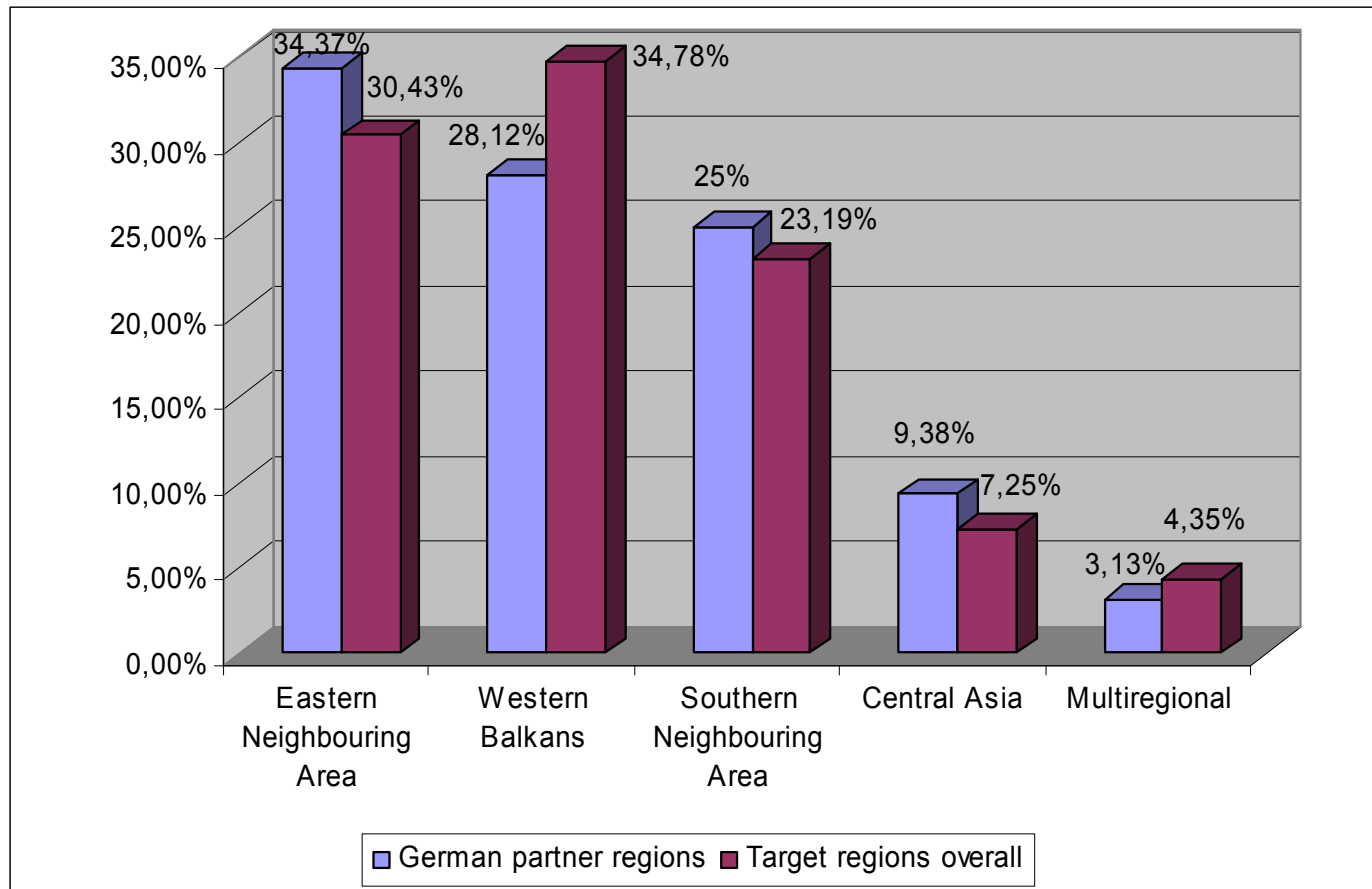

## TEMPUS IV (2007-2013)

### Conclusions drawn from German regional activity in TEMPUS IV

- ▶ German involvement in all partner regions!
- ▶ Focus on cooperation with Eastern Neighbourhood
- ▶ German coordination strong in Eastern Neighbourhood
- ▶ Less (no) activity as coordinator in the Southern Neighbourhood
