II. ERASMUS Mundus II – what's new?

ACTION 1:

- Erasmus Mundus Joint Masters Courses (including higher education institutions from Third Countries)
- Erasmus Mundus Joint Doctoral Programmes (including higher education institutions from Third Countries)
- Scholarship scheme for outstanding Third Country master students
- Scholarship scheme for outstanding Third Country doctoral students
- Scholarship scheme for outstanding European master and doctoral students
- Scholarship scheme for short-term stays of European and Third Country scholars



II. ERASMUS Mundus II – what's new?

ACTION 2:

- Integration of the External Cooperation Window (ECW) as Action 2 in the ERASMUS Mundus Programme (EM)
- ECW is complementary to EM
- ECW funds partnerships between European and Third Country higher education institutions with grants covering:
 - the organisation costs of student and academic staff mobility
 - the implementation costs of individual mobility flows of students and academic staff

ACTION 3:

- Grants for National Structures



III. Opportunities for Third-Countries

Higher Education Institutions from a Third-Country can participate:

➤ In Action 1

As an active partner in joint master and/or doctoral programmes

➤ In Action 2

As a an active partner coming from the geographical area concerned and acting in a structured cooperation partnership with European Higher Education Institutions (see annual call)

➤ In Action 3

As an active partner in projects enhancing the attractiveness of the European Higher Education sector and facilitating the cooperation with the rest of the world



III. Opportunities for Third-Countries

Individuals from a Third-Country can participate:

➤ In **Action 1**

Applying for a full-term scholarship as a:

- Master student in an Erasmus Mundus Master Course
- Doctoral candidate in an Erasmus Mundus Doctoral Programme

Applying for a short-term stay as a:

- Scholar

➤ In **Action 2**

Applying for a scholarship as a:

- Bachelor student
- Master student
- Doctoral candidate
- Post-doctoral candidate
- Scholar
- Professional
