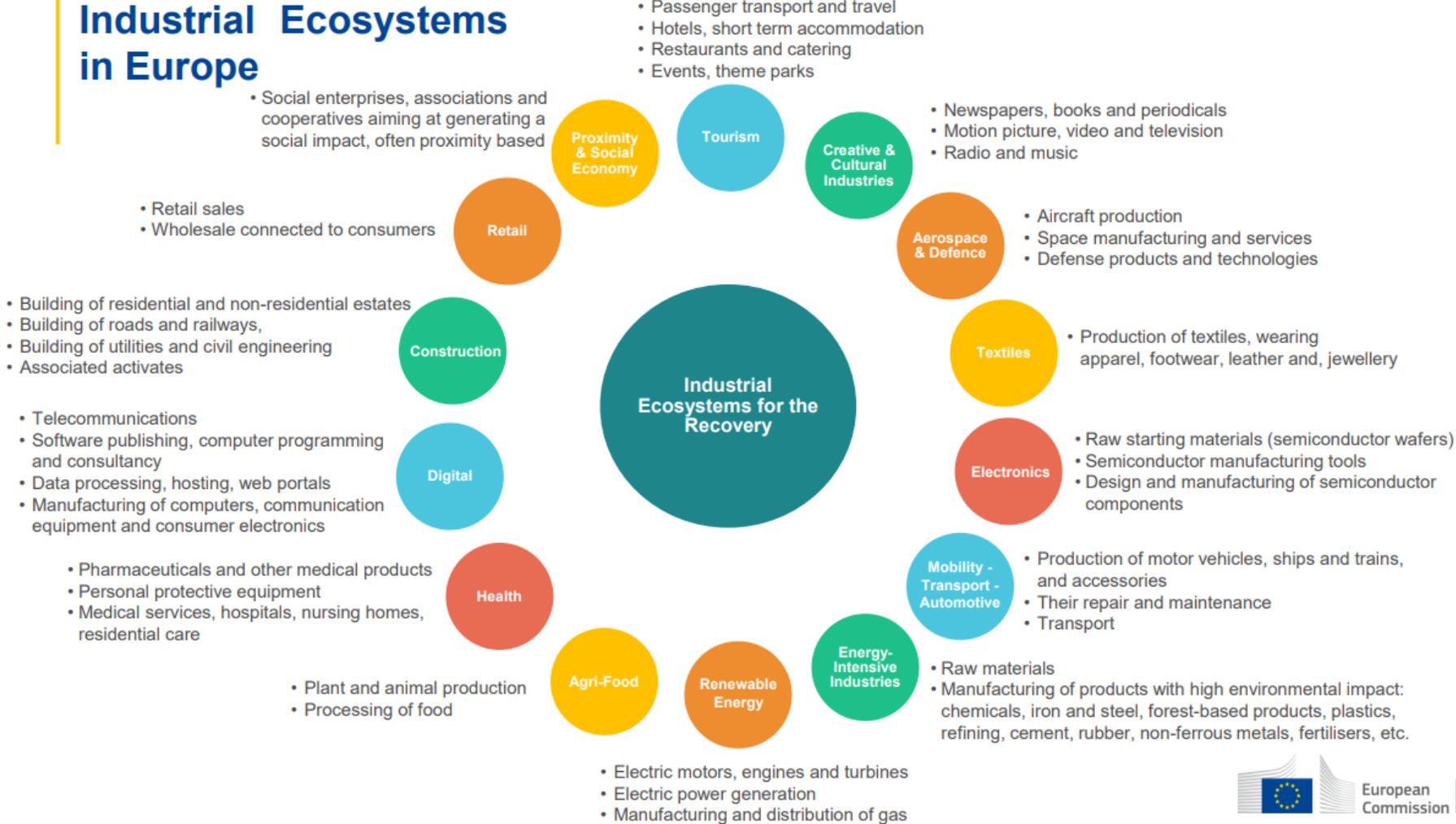

We base our needs analysis on (1) findings from literature on digital change agents, digital transformation and the F&B sector. Moreover, (2) we undertook a desk research on current offerings by higher education institutions in that area. In addition, (3) we conducted a preliminary qualitative study through interviews with experts from local F&B manufacturing SMEs of various digital readiness levels. This led to the identification of specific digitalization drivers and barriers in their companies and industry.

In the flow of this needs analysis, we take into consideration three key target groups for our project:

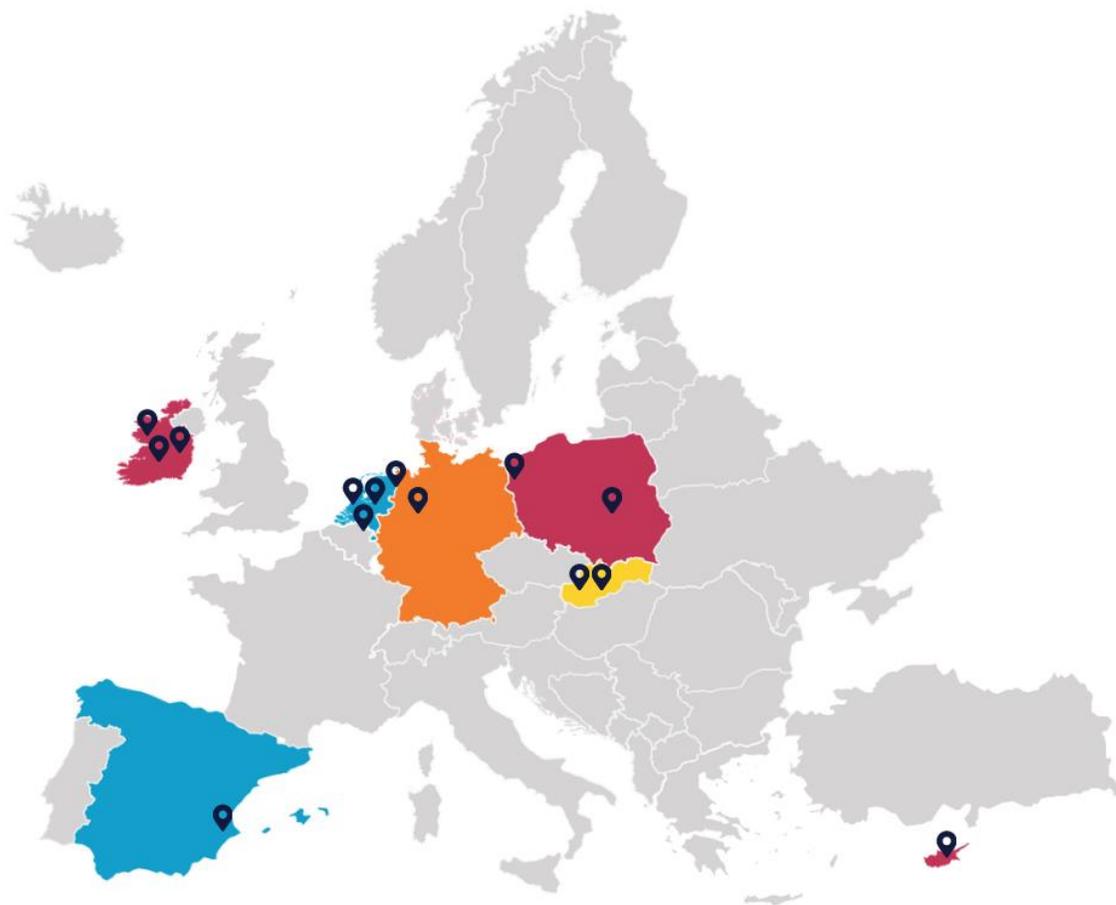

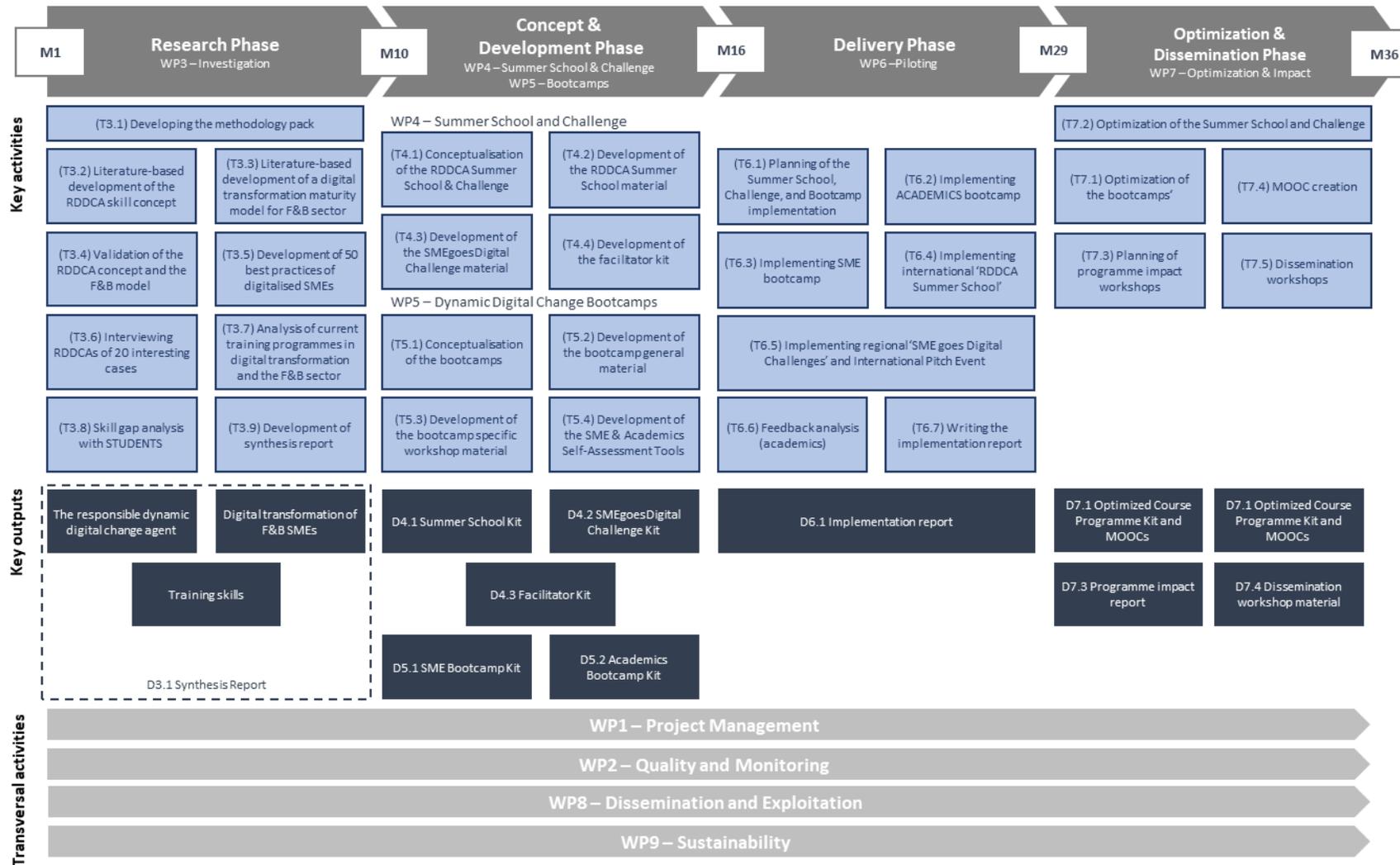

1ST, 2ND and 3RD SUBMISSION

1st Submission: 57 / 100

The fact that the objectives make sense only on a very general level is due to the general nature of the needs analysis. The analysis of needs is convincing as to the lack of digital skills in different areas, including the targeted food and beverage industry, and the pressures this has created in light of Covid-19. The target groups are also appropriately identified, albeit generically. However, the needs analysis does not say much in regard to the very specific challenges facing the food and beverage industry it aims to address, nor does it refer to the existing training as a means to illustrate the concrete improvements it aims to bring about. Likewise, the analysis of needs says little about the specific regional and national context or institutional necessities in question.

2nd Submission: 74 / 100

The overall project methodology does not fully meet the necessary requirements. The proposal describes the methodological approaches adopted both for the project design and for the development of the course, but the usage of the relevant tools and EU frameworks for the skills applied for the different occupations of the food and beverage sector is not aptly specified.

With regard to innovation, the project proposes an action research approach to developing an evidence-based programme and to optimise it according to feedback. The problem-based learning approach is also to be used as a combination of didactics based on up-to-date teaching methods (e.g. action learning and flipped classroom formats). It is not fully specified how they will be employed in the final educational products. However, the basic idea shows a good level of innovation in different terms: methodologically, by building an effective connection between VET and HE sectors enhancing also the digital culture in SMEs; technically, by building a bridge between different existing teaching and training methodologies connected with the three skills families included in the new curriculum.

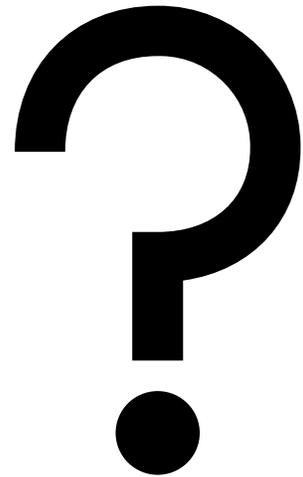

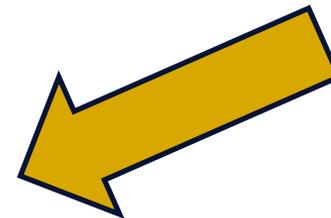
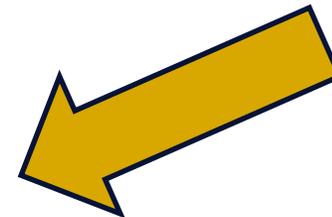
