#### **OBJECTIVES**

Capacity Building in Higher Education supports a successful green, digital and sustainable global economic recovery in third countries, linked to the Sustainable Development Goals (SDGs) and to the Paris Agreement<sup>[1]</sup>.

Some of CBHE projects objectives are:

- Improving quality of higher education in third countries not associated to the Erasmus+ Programme<sup>[2]</sup>;
- Promoting inclusive education, equality, equity, nondiscrimination and the promotion of civic competences in higher education;
- Fostering cooperation of institutions and cooperation across different regions of the world.

#### **PARTNERSHIPS**

- Partnerships made up of organisations active in the field of higher education from EU Member States and third countries associated to Erasmus+ on the one hand and organisations from particular regions of the world on the other;
- CBHE activities and outcomes should benefit the third countries.

#### **ACTIVITIES**

CBHE project activities aim to (non-exhaustive list):

- Develop and adapt curricula, new learning methods and tools;
- Improve higher education skills, governance and management;
- Ensure equity and social inclusion in education;
- Support cooperation between universities and businesses to enhance better employability of students;
- Assist policy-making and reform at national and regional levels.





- HIGHER EDUCATION
  Facilitate access to newcomer organisations or less experienced organisations;
- Focus on Higher Education Institutions (HEIs) from least developed third countries and/or located in remote areas;
- Boost the HEIs' capacities for internationalisation;
- Focus on students and staff with fewer opportunities.

## STRAND 2 - PARTNERSHIPS FOR TRANSFORMATION IN HIGHER EDUCATION

- Innovative projects that include an active engagement with the business world and with research;
- Benefit for HEIs in innovation, knowledge-sharing and governance;
- Aim to strengthen the capacities of the targeted HEIs to address the 21st century challenges;
- Introduce new approaches and initiatives affecting not only the institutions but also the society at large.

#### **STRAND 3 - STRUCTURAL REFORM PROJECTS**

- Support structural reforms, policy initiatives and innovation in higher education in third countries;
- Address the efforts of third countries to develop coherent and sustainable systems of higher education to meet their socio-economic needs and create a knowledge-driven economy;
- Involve the competent National Authorities of the third countries responsible for education (compulsory element).

Type of projects and number of organisations

National projects address only one third country not associated to the Erasmus+ Programme.

**Multi-country projects** address two or more third countries not associated to Erasmus+. They can be multi-country projects within one single region (regional projects) or involving more than one region (cross-regional projects).

For **Strand 3** (both national and multi-country), projects must involve as full partner(s) the national higher education authority(ies) of the third country(ies).

The **number of organisations** from EU Member States and third countries associated to the Erasmus+ Programme may not be higher than the number of organisations from third countries not associated to the Erasmus+ Programme.
