

Achieving Automatic Recognition



28 April 2023, Tirana

Setting the context on automatic recognition:

- 2022 monitoring Report on the implementation of the LRC
- 2018 Council Recommendation on promoting automatic recognition

Different approaches to automatic recognition:

- Legally and not legally binding agreements
- National databases with comparability statements available for download

Transversal solution to support automatic recognition:

- Information provision as one of the pre-conditions for automatic recognition
- Digital solutions for the verification of authenticity and Quality Assurance


