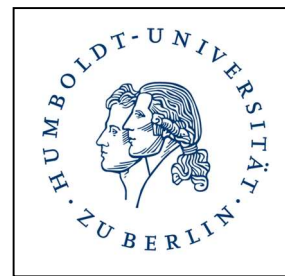

Breakout Session 1:

Exchange about current developments /processes

Paul Leys (Senior Relationship Manager)

With the LA and IIA, important milestones in EWP digitization have been implemented, and there are lively discussions about further building blocks (Transcripts of Records). What were and are the challenges? How can we achieve the goal of a fully digital IIA/LA workflow and what are the obstacles? There is also a focus on institutional structures: digitization is not the sole responsibility of the International Offices. But how can exchange and synergies be created across departmental boundaries using the LA/IIA as an example? What can we take away from this for future modules (e.g. ToR)? In the session, participants can share their experiences and approaches.

Breakout Session 2:

A Hitchhiker's Guide to EWP for Newcomer

Erasmus+ Digital Experts & Maximilian Pinnen (NA DAAD)

This session is aimed at participants with little or no prior knowledge of EWP. In addition to teaching relevant terminology, the aim of the session is to familiarize participants with the most important sources of information and their respective benefits. Communication channels to support implementation (DG EAC, Relationship Manager, NA DAAD) will also be presented. The session will be rounded off by an exchange on synergies and networking with employees from other universities who are at a similar implementation point.
