



# Applications EMJM 2021- Involvement of third country institutions not associated to the Programme


70 EMJM

- **864 associated partners** → 320 institutions from third countries not associated to the Programme




## Number of coordinated EMJMDs per Programme Country

# Award criteria (Erasmus+ Programme Guide)



## Scores (total 100 points) and thresholds



Award Criteria	Maximum Scores
1. Relevance	30 (22 funding threshold)
2.1. Quality - project design & implementation	30
2.2. Quality – partnerships & cooperation arrangements	20
3. Impact	20
Total	100 (70 funding threshold)

## ❖ Relevance of the project” (max. 30 points)

- ✓ Background and general objectives
- ✓ Needs analysis and specific objectives
- ✓ Complementarity with other actions and innovation

**What – Why and How – What else (special)**



## ❖ Quality of the project design and implementation (max. 30 points)

- ✓ **Concept and methodology**
- ✓ **Quality assurance, monitoring and evaluation strategy**
- ✓ **Project teams, staff and experts**
- ✓ **Cost effectiveness and financial management**
- ✓ **Risk management**



## ❖ Quality of the partnership & cooperation arrangements (max. 20 points)

### ✓ Consortium set-up:

- e.g. rationale for the consortium composition
- innovative character of the consortium and inclusion of partners with different levels of experience,
- definition of roles and tasks of partners
- cooperation with non-educational actors



### ✓ Consortium management and decision-making:

- e.g. cooperation arrangements,
- governing bodies and management tools
- institutional commitment of the partners

## ❖ Impact (max. 20 points)



### ✓ Impact and ambition:

- e.g. impact at system level, institutional level and individual level
- projections in terms of enrolled students
- measures to ensure country balance of students

### ✓ Communication, dissemination and visibility:

- e.g. promotion strategy to attract excellent students worldwide

### ✓ Sustainability and continuation:

- e.g. mid/long-term development and sustainability strategy beyond EU funding
- mobilization of other funding sources

## Award criteria

### DO's

- ✓ Respond to the **sub-points** of Award Criteria paying attention to **specific context**
- ✓ Get all points across in **structured** and **coherent** manner, but keep it **short and simple**
- ✓ Present all **important** and **distinguishing project features**  
—> experts' assessment is based **only** on information provided in the application
- ✓ Provide **supporting evidence**

## Award criteria

### DON'Ts

- ✗ *Avoid being **vague** in demonstrating the project's reasoning and strengths*
- ✗ *Do not assume that because of your expertise and **previous experience**, you do not need to explain how your project is built-up and will develop in the future*
- ✗ *Do not present your proposal as the sum of each partner's contribution, but demonstrate the **joint undertaking** of the consortium*

# Application package

The application form is structured in **3 parts**

- **Part A - Administrative Forms**

Contains general information about the project, data on the applicant organisation and contact persons

- **Part B – Technical description & annexes**

Contains the narrative part of the project, the work packages, milestones & deliverables.

- **Part C – Administrative forms**

Specificities about the EMJM (numbers of ECTS, accreditation, type of degrees to be awarded, etc)

- Complete Part A & C directly on the Portal
- Prepare Part B in advance and upload it together with the mandatory annexes (and the optional ones if applicable)

# Part B – Work Packages

## Tips and clarifications

- **A work package means a major sub-division of the project.** The work packages refer to and **should be aligned with the award criteria**. In a work package, the information on your project should be structured along expected outcomes, milestones and deliverables. The grouping of the activities should be logical and guided by identifiable outputs.
- As indicated in the template, EMJM proposals should have **fixed work packages**  
Management and coordination / Selection and supervision of students / Curriculum implementation / Promotion of the master programme / Impact, sustainability and dissemination of results

# EMJM call for proposals 2022



- ✓ Opening of the Call: **November 2021 (tbc)**
- ✓ Deadline: **Mid February 2022 (tbc)**
- ✓ Budget: **tbc**
- ✓ Nr. of projects: **~ 27 (tbc)**
- ✓ Nr of scholarships per project: **max. 60 + additional scholarships for students from targeted regions (tbc)**



# EMJM – How to apply

## Where?

- ✓ Applications must be submitted through the European Commission's Funding & Tender Opportunities Portal (F&TP) using the Portal Submission System.

## Who?

- ✓ Proposals must be created and submitted by a contact person of the coordinating organization.

## When?

**Deadline: Mid February 2022 (TBC)**



Applicants are highly recommended to submit proposals as early as possible and at least 48 hours prior to the call deadline.

## Preparation

- Read carefully the information on the [Roles and access rights](#) and decide the persons who will manage the application.

# Get prepared



- Read carefully all the call documents

[Erasmus+ Programme Guide](#), application templates and specific instructions published in the F&TP under the respective [Topic conditions and documents](#)

- Plan your project and define your work plan

Work packages, milestones, deliverables

- Create an EU Login account

To be able to submit a proposal, you must register on the Portal for an [EU Login account](#)

- Make sure your organisation has a valid Participant Identification code (PIC). If not, get one !

Accreditation check of Masters	March/April 2022
Award Decision	June 2022
Notification of applicants and publication of results	July 2022
Preparation and signature of grant agreements	July/August 2022
Start of projects	Autumn
